

Lower Scores Were Obtained for the Following Evaluation Areas (<90%):

1. Leadership Skills (70%):

 The score for leadership skills indicates a need for more emphasis on developing leadership qualities within the program, potentially through additional workshops, practical activities, or leadership-focused projects.

2. Entrepreneurship (70%):

 A relatively low score suggests that the program could better address entrepreneurial aspects, which are increasingly relevant in the pharmaceutical industry. Adding modules or activities that focus on entrepreneurship may help address this gap.

3. Teamwork (83.3%):

While teamwork skills were rated positively, they were slightly lower than other areas.
 This could be improved by incorporating more group-based assignments or interprofessional education sessions.

4. Mastering Specific Employment-Related Skills/Knowledge (83.3%):

 While the score is relatively high, it indicates room for improvement in aligning program content with specific industry requirements.

5. Experiences with Co-op Programs, Internships, or Practical Training (76.7%):

 The score for practical experiences is lower than other areas, suggesting that students desire more opportunities for hands-on learning. Increasing partnerships with industry and clinical settings may enhance this area.

6. Print-Based Library Resources (80%) and Computer-Based Library Resources (80%):

 These scores suggest that library resources are satisfactory but could be expanded or updated to meet evolving student needs.

Better Results Were Obtained for Other Areas in the Rating (90%-100%):

1. Academic Challenge and Program Quality:

 The program is academically challenging (100%), and 90% of students rated the program as being of high quality.

2. Teaching Effectiveness:

- o Professors were highly rated for being knowledgeable (100%), organized (100%), and intellectually challenging (100%).
- Useful feedback on academic performance was acknowledged by 90% of students.

3. **Preparation for Career:**

 86.7% of students found the program provided good career preparation, and 100% appreciated the development of oral communication, computer proficiency, and understanding of professional/ethical responsibilities.

4. Learning Environment and Classroom Experiences:

- Classroom instruction was rated at 100%, while laboratory experiences scored 86.7%.
- o Study experiences and experiences with computer-based technology both scored 96.7%.

5. Recommendation of the Program:

 96.7% of students would recommend the program to others, reflecting a strong overall satisfaction with the program.

Summary:

The program excels in most areas, especially academic rigor, teaching quality, and student satisfaction. Lower scores in leadership, entrepreneurship, teamwork, and practical experiences indicate potential areas for enhancement. Addressing these areas could further strengthen the program and better prepare graduates for the demands of the pharmaceutical field.
